HARVEST BAN v's TOTAL VEHICLE BAN

<u>TOTAL FIRE BAN</u> – This is a ban declared by DFES on days of **extreme weather** or when the state has widespread fires that are seriously stretching firefighting resources.

The need for this ban is assessed throughout the day and the ban may be lifted if weather conditions ease. A **TOTAL FIRE BAN** is declared the night before it is due to take effect. Often there is a news announcement relating to this, and you can also check the DFES website after 6pm to check to see if a TFB has been declared.

When a TFB has been declared it prohibits the lighting of any fires in the open air, and any other activities that may start a fire. The ban includes all open fires for the purposes of cooking or camping. It also includes incinerators, welding, grinding, soldering or gas cutting.

Following consultation with local governments, recent changes to TFB regulations have been introduced that broaden the activities FARMERS can undertake during these bans. The changes mean farmers can now continue day-to-day agricultural activity such as harvesting, feeding and moving livestock when a TFB is in place, as long as a **HARVEST/VEHICLE MOVEMENT BAN** has not been implemented by the Shire. Certain activities likely to create a bushfire danger such as operating an oxytorch, welding and operating grinders in the open air are still banned.

The changes also remove the requirement for farmers to have a firefighting vehicle on site when undertaking agricultural activities during a TFB, although local government local laws may require it during harvest/haymaking.

A HARVEST/VEHICLE MOVEMENT BAN is applied by the <u>local government</u> in consultation with the Chief Bushfire Control Officer, Deputy and Fire Officers. The local government can declare this under the *Bushfires Regulations 1954*. It is generally applied for the 'heat of the day', however periods may be extended or lifted by the local government should the weather conditions change. The Shire has a text message service that locals or contractors can be added to so that they are advised of any bans. Please contact the Shire if you wish your number to be added to this list.

ATTENDING FIRES

It is in the interest of all residents to be a <u>registered member</u> of the Volunteer Bush Fire Brigade covering the area in which they live or where they own land.

Membership of a Brigade is the safest way to ensure cover under the Shire's Volunteer Insurance Policy which covers personal injury and damage to equipment resulting from fighting bushfires under the control of a Fire Control Officer. Please contact your local brigade Captain (contact details on back) or the Shire for more information.

If you attend a fire as a volunteer firefighter, you should wear the Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) provided by the Shire and fully enclosed work boots (not supplied). Remember it is important to stay hydrated, so take a water bottle with you. If you required PPE (goggles, jacket or pants) please contact the Shire.

It is also very important when you arrive at a fire that you let whoever is in charge of the fire know that you are at the fire (for insurance purposes).

Fixed Water Standpipes

The Water Corporation implemented new charging arrangement for fixed standpipes, effective from the 1st July 2019. As part of this process a number of standpipes are only for firefighting purposes.

The Shire is also required to lock these standpipes.

The following is a list of the standpipes that are now accessible only for firefighting:

- Williams Collie Road (near State Forest)
- Pinjarra Williams Road (near Marling Road)
- Pinjarra Williams Road (near Williams Darkan Road)
- Pinjarra Williams Road (near Williams Sportsground)

Keys will be held by the Shire and nearby Fire Control Officers.
