

Williams Bridge Replacement



Construction works to replace two bridges on Albany Highway, in Williams, to commence in late November.

Construction work to replace two bridges along the Albany Highway in Williams, one at the southern end of the town over Williams River and one at the northern end over Coalling Creek, will commence on Monday, 26 November.

The road between the bridges will also be rehabilitated and upgrades will be made to the intersection of Albany Highway and Richardson Road.

Work will be undertaken by a joint venture between Coleman Rail Pty Ltd and MACA Civil Pty Ltd and is expected to be completed by the end of 2019.

How do I access local business?

All businesses will be open as usual during the works.

Works will be completed in stages to minimise the impact to businesses in Williams however, street parking will be limited during this time.

How will traffic be impacted?

To allow traffic to continue using Albany Highway in Williams, side tracks for both bridges have been constructed and a temporary bridge has been installed over the Williams River.

Speed restrictions will be in place during the works and drivers are urged to slow down, obey all signs and allow extra time for your journey.

Oversized loads will need to seek alternative routes during the works.
